Defining the Toronto skyline, the CN Tower is Canada's most recognizable and celebrated icon. At a height of 553.33m (1,815 ft., 5 inches), it is Canada's National Tower, the World's Tallest Building, an important telecommunications hub, and the centre of tourism in Toronto.

The Hockey Hall of Fame was founded in 1943 to establish a memorial to those who have developed Canada's great winter sport -- ice hockey. Incorporated in 1983, Hockey Hall of Fame and Museum ("HHFM") exists in order to honour and preserve the history of the game of ice hockey, and in particular, those who have made outstanding contributions and achievements in the development of the game

The Hershey Centre, is a state-of-the-art multipurpose arena and home to the Mississauga IceDogs of the Ontario Hockey League. The Hershey Centre has played host to over 1000 events. The main, 5,400-seat arena is complemented by three additional (85'X 200') ice surfaces used by minor and adult hockey, figure skating clubs and other community groups.
