EARLY IDENTIFICATION SERVICES AND DESCRIPTIONS

Universal Services

Durham Health Connection Line	A free, confidential telephone help line available in Durham Region. Public Health Nurses, available Monday—Friday between 9 am and 6 pm, help you access the information and resources needed to protect and promote your health.
Healthy Babies Healthy Children	A free universal voluntary program to support expecting parents and families with children from birth to age six. The service provides parents the support they need to give their children a successful start in life.
Ontario Early Years Centres	Free early learning programs for parent/caregivers and their children birth to six, parenting resources and training, pre and post natal resources, information about other early years services in your community.
Children's Services Division	Provides children and families with high quality child care programs and related services recognizing both individual needs and the diversity of our community.
Best Start / Parent and Family Literacy Hubs	Early Years Hubs are open to children from birth to age six, who are accompanied by a parent, grandparent or caregiver. This provides an opportunity for adults and children to learn together in a welcoming and stimulating school environment.
Durham Parenting Program Calendar	An on-line calendar of events providing families with access to parenting programs and services within their communities.

Intervention and Treatment Services

Blind Low Vision Early Intervention Program	Designed to give children who are born blind or with low vision the best possible start in life. Family support; intervention services, and consultation services are available for children from birth to Grade 1.
Infant Hearing Program	Designed to identify all infants with permanent hearing impairment; give parents the information they need to make timely, informed decisions; and provide the services necessary to maximize family communication and language development.
Durham Preschool Speech & Language	Provides assessment and a range of treatment services to families and children from birth to school entry.
Infant and Child Development	Family –centered early intervention and prevention for infants and young children birth to six years with, or at risk for, delays in development or disabilities.
Durham Children's Aid Society	Services provided include child protection, foster care, residential, adoption, and volunteer services.

Additional Services

Kinark Child and Family Services	A children's mental health agency that provides a full range of free and confidential programs and services to children and youth with mental health issues, as well as support to their families/caregivers.
Grandview Children's Centre	Provides medical services, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech language pathology, audiology, family support services, and recreation services to children and youth with special needs.
Durham Behaviour Management Services	Individualized behavioural consultation services to assist in problem solving specific behavioural concerns.
Resources for Exceptional Children and Youth	Services provided include child care, case management, resource information, and developmental programming to children and youth with special needs and their families.
