

## Alcohol and Pregnancy Provincial Awareness Campaign Backgrounder

## **Background**

Prenatal exposure to alcohol can result in a wide range of life long problems and is linked to permanent brain damage, low birth weight, birth defects and developmental delays. Best Start: Ontario's Maternal, Newborn and Early Child Development Resource Centre is committed to helping reduce the use of alcohol during pregnancy, by focusing on prevention. In collaboration with its partners, Best Start is launching a provincial public awareness and education campaign on alcohol use and pregnancy which will rollout across Ontario in May and June 2004.

The campaign has been developed with input from an Advisory Committee, which includes representatives from FASworld; FAS/FAE Information Service, CCSA; Motherisk; Health Canada; Ontario Federation of Indian Friendship Centres; Ontario Prevention Clearinghouse; Best Start; and Ontario Ministry of Health – Public Health Branch.

## **About the Campaign**

The aim of the Alcohol and Pregnancy Awareness Campaign is to increase awareness about the benefits of not drinking alcohol during pregnancy and to encourage health care providers to recommend that women stop drinking alcohol prior to and during pregnancy.

The campaign includes advertising in buses, subways, movie theatres and shopping malls, publicity on radio, television and in newspapers and a website <a href="www.alcoholfreepregnancy.ca">www.alcoholfreepregnancy.ca</a>. Best Start has developed campaign resources which will be distributed through community groups, health care providers and through the LCBO retail stores.
